

The Miracle Lives at the Table

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BIG IDEA

Pull up a chair—Jesus does His best work in shared space.

KEY SCRIPTURES

John 2:1-11

1. In John 2:1-2, why does it matter that Jesus was invited rather than forcing His way in—and what does that expose about how you treat His presence in everyday life?
2. Where have you been waiting to feel “ready” before practicing hospitality, and what would it look like to make room on purpose this week?
3. John 2:3 names the shortage out loud (“They have no more wine”). What “running out” are you currently trying to manage quietly instead of naming honestly?
4. What’s the difference between a community that turns shortage into shame and a community that turns shortage into shared concern? Which one are you building?
5. In John 2:5, Mary says, “Do whatever He tells you.” What’s one area where you want Jesus to fix things, but you’re resisting simple obedience?
6. In John 2:6-7, why do you think Jesus chose an unglamorous, heavy, repetitive task (“Fill the jars”) as the pathway to the miracle?
7. Who are the “fill the jars” people in your life or church—steady, unseen servants—and how can you strengthen them (not just appreciate them)?
8. The wine didn’t just return, it was better than what came before. Where have you lowered your expectations to “just get by” instead of trusting Jesus for renewed joy and overflow?
9. John 2:11 says this sign revealed Jesus’ glory and produced belief. How could your table (your shared space) become a platform where people see who Jesus really is?
