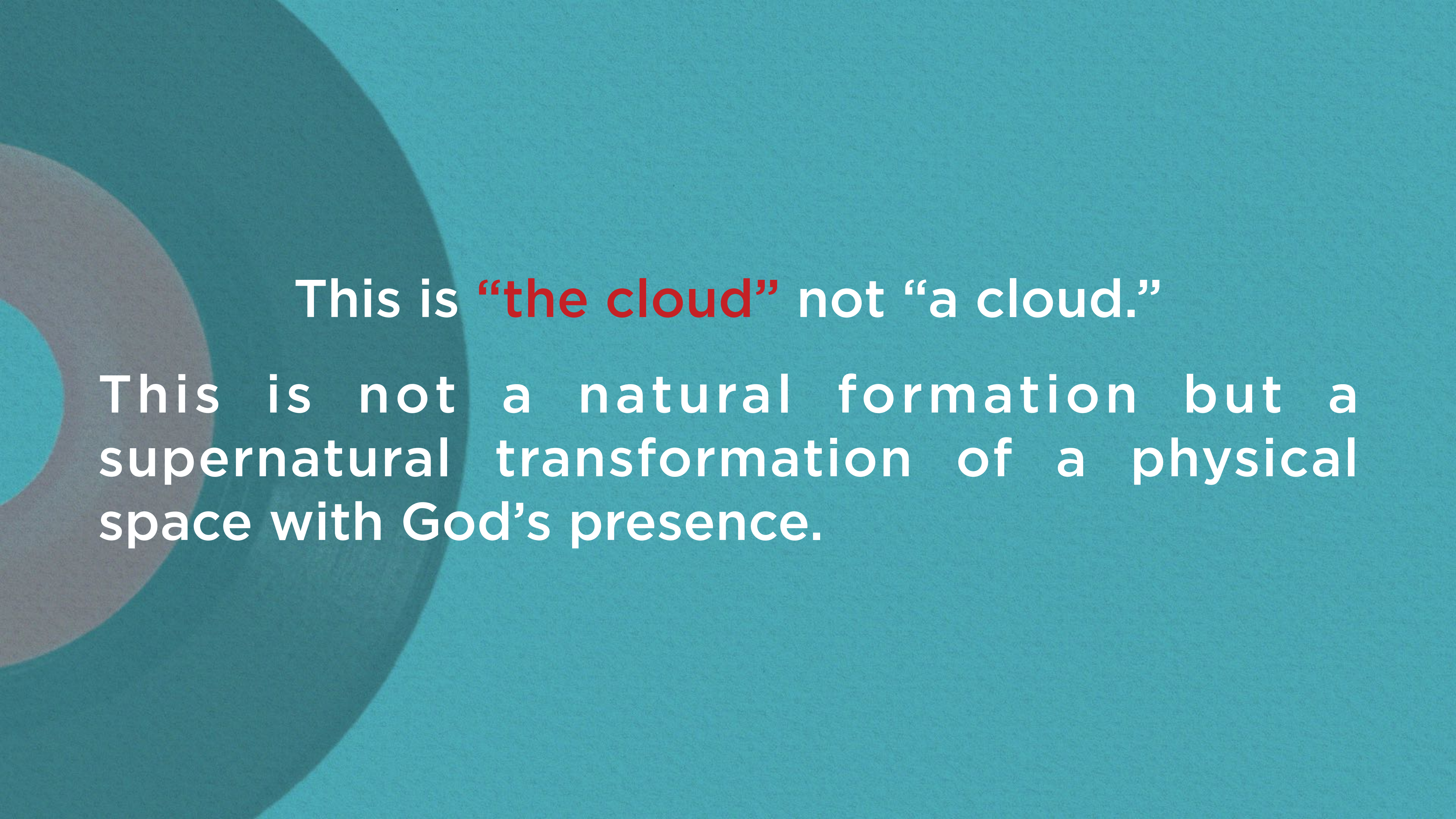

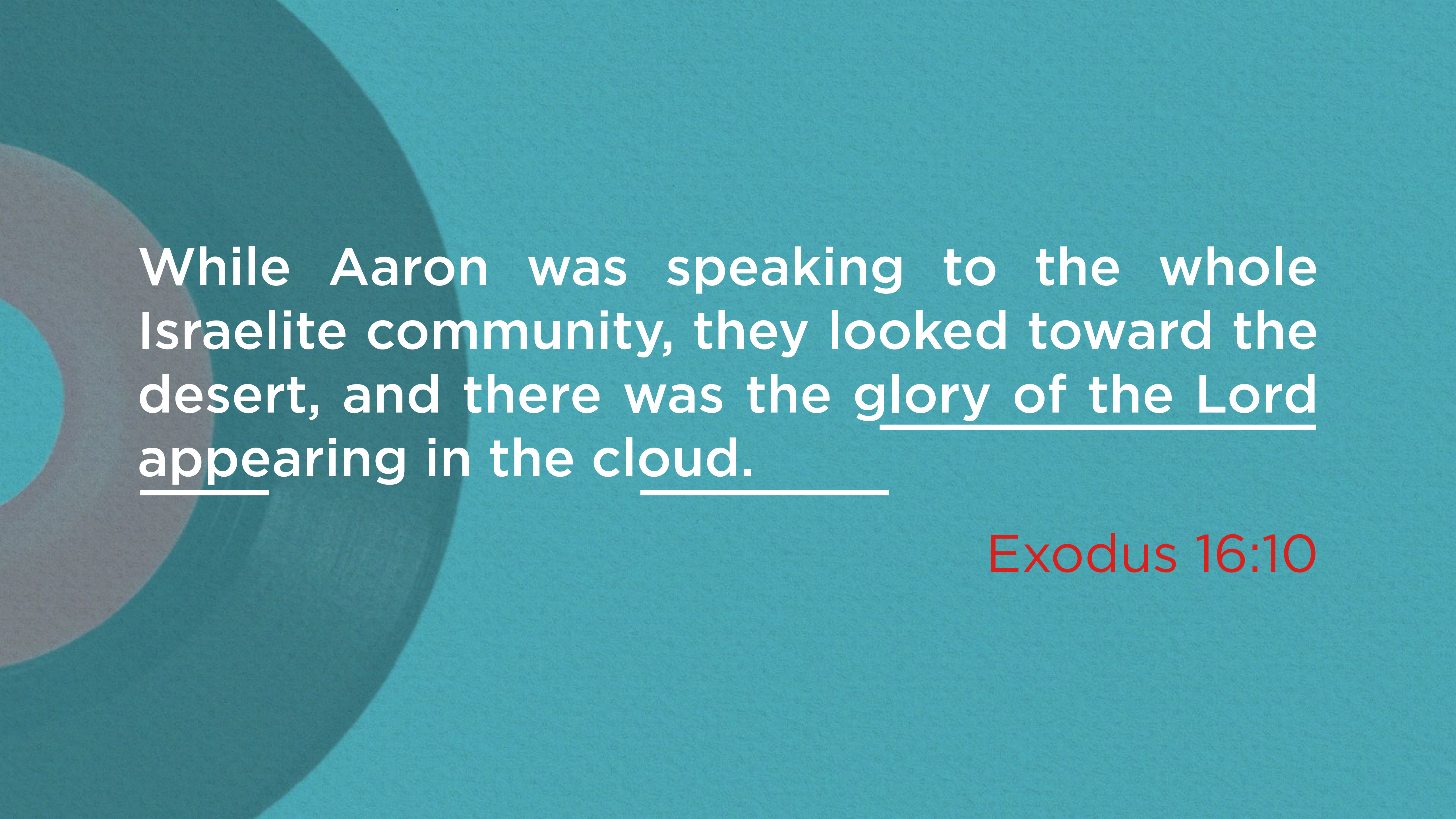

This is not a natural formation but a supernatural transformation of a physical space with God’s presence.

Then the angel of God, who had been traveling in front of Israel's army, withdrew and went behind them. The pillar of cloud also moved from in front and stood behind them, coming between the armies of Egypt and Israel. Throughout the night the cloud brought darkness to the one side and light to the other side; so neither went near the other all night long.

While Aaron was speaking to the whole Israelite community, they looked toward the desert, and there was the glory of the Lord appearing in the cloud.

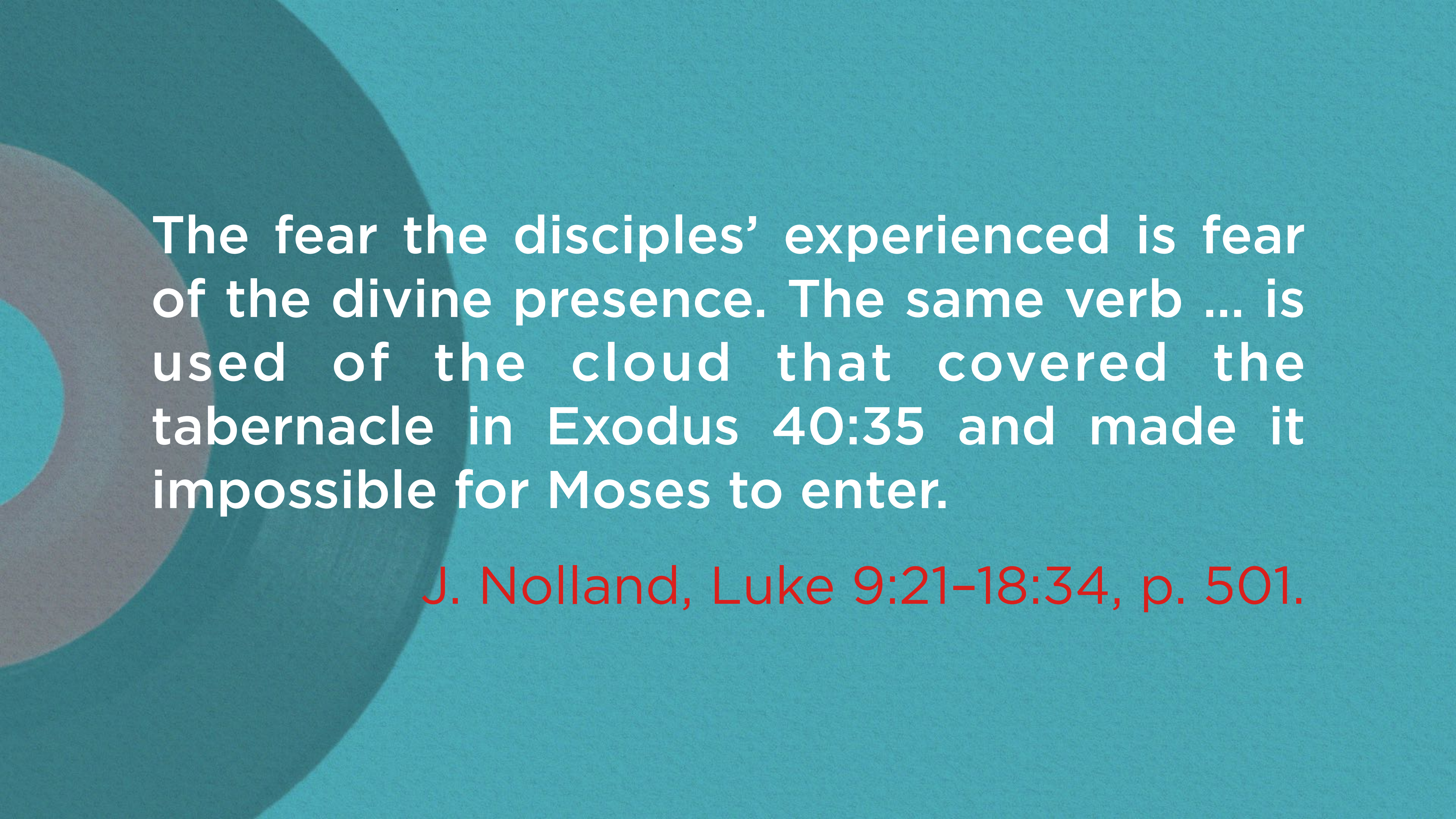
Exodus 16:10

Luke 9:34-36



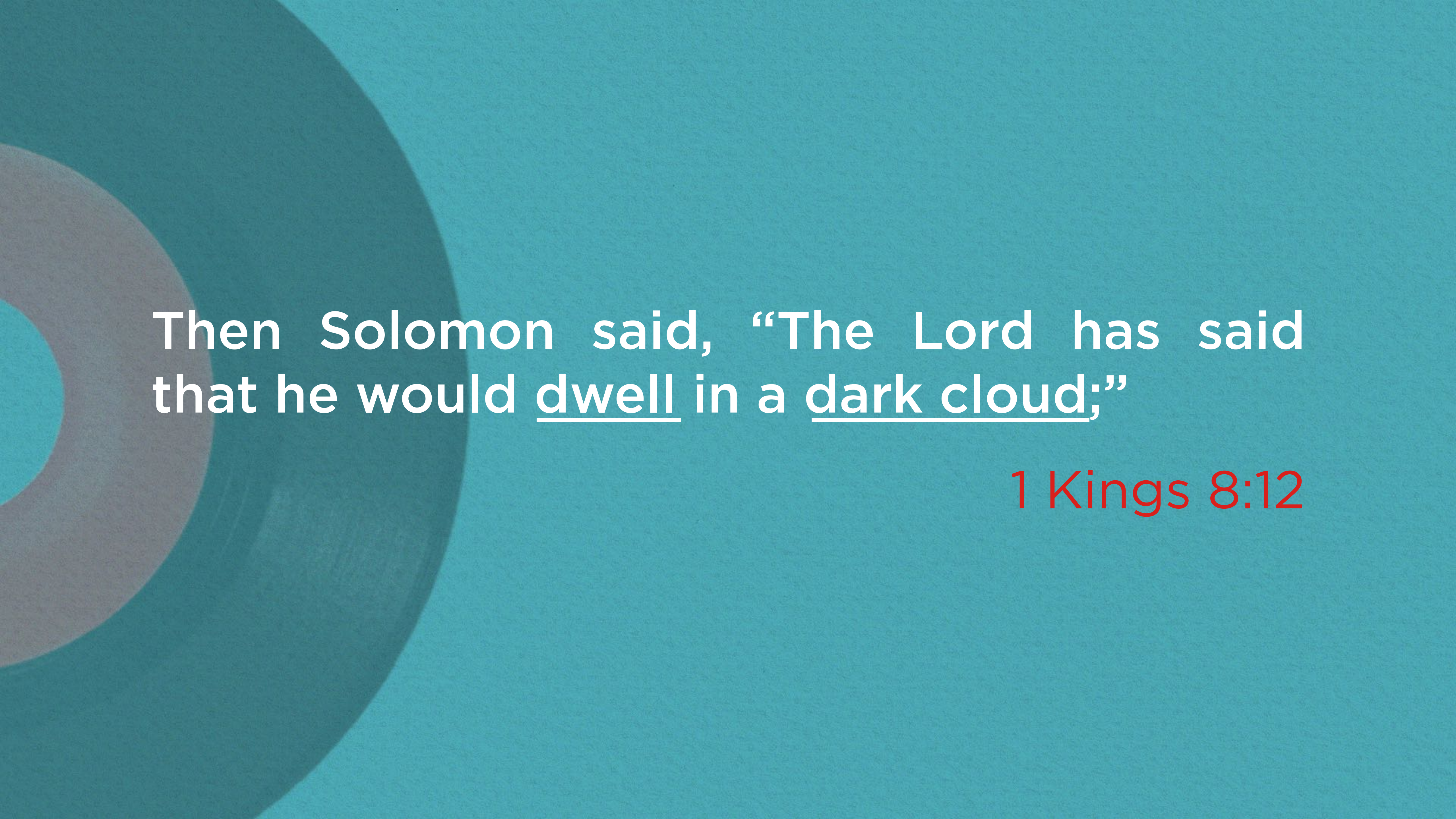

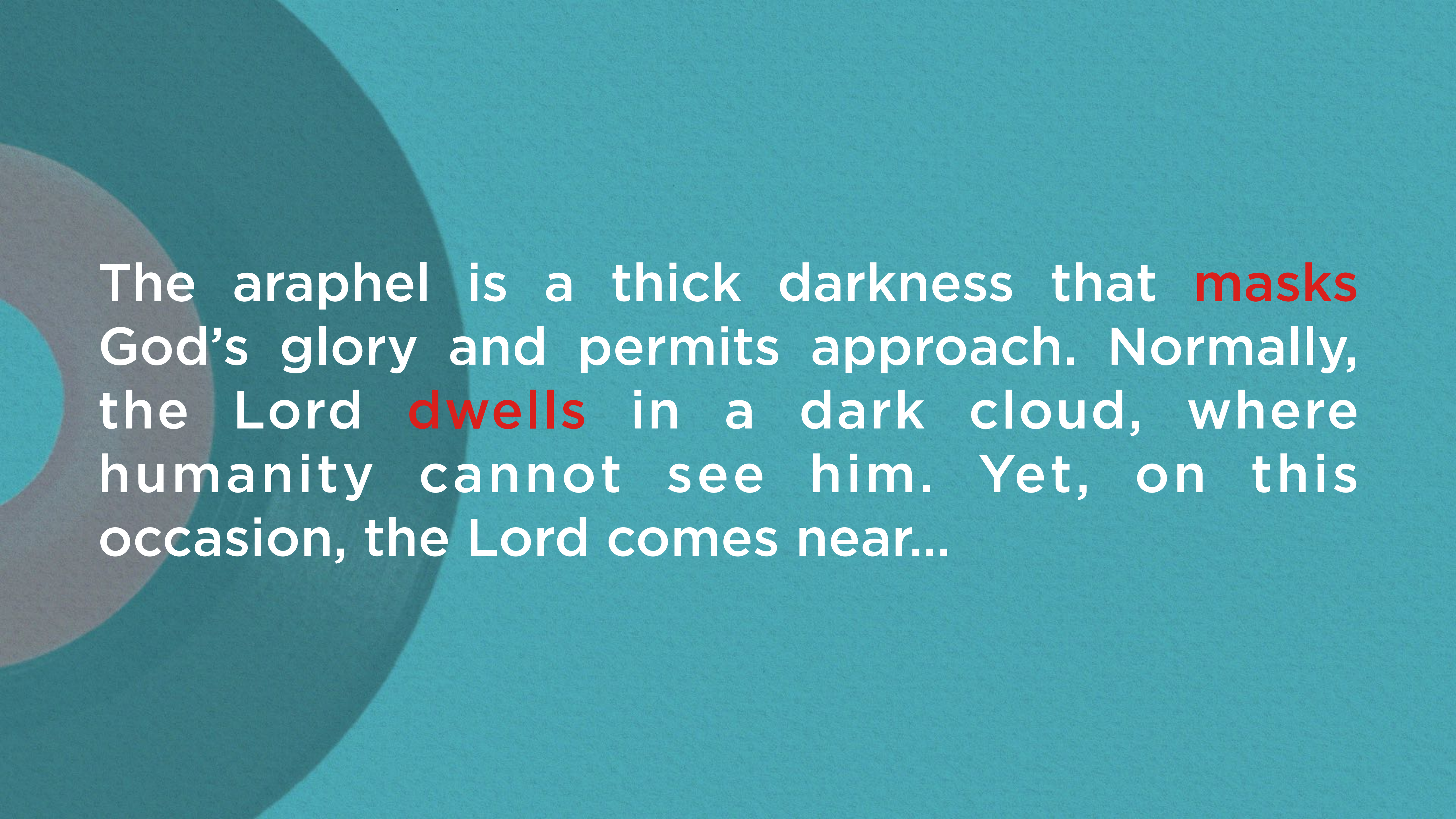

Dark Cloud עֲרָפֶל araphel

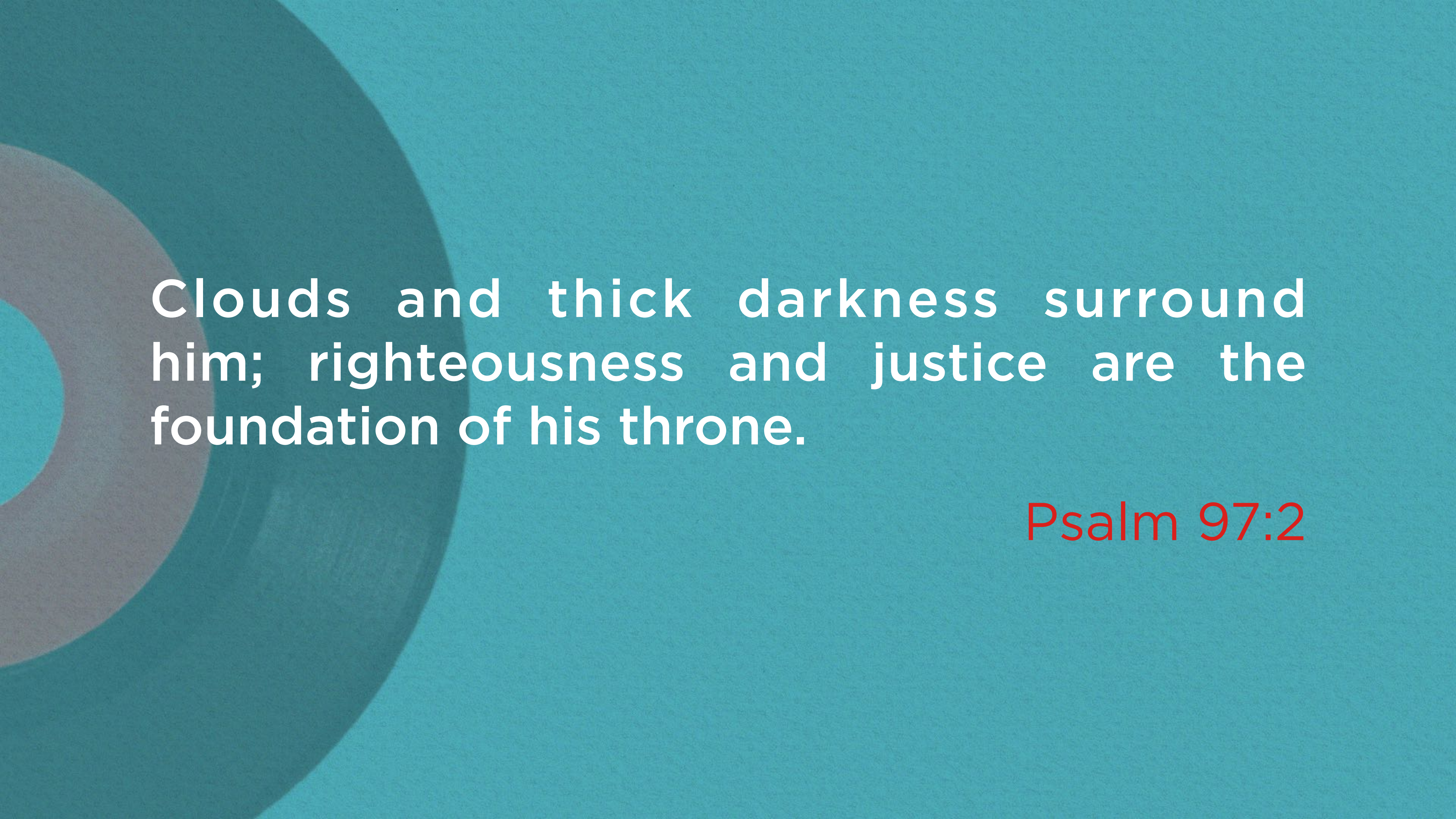
cloud, heavy cloud, deep darkness,

presence**' for our own worship?

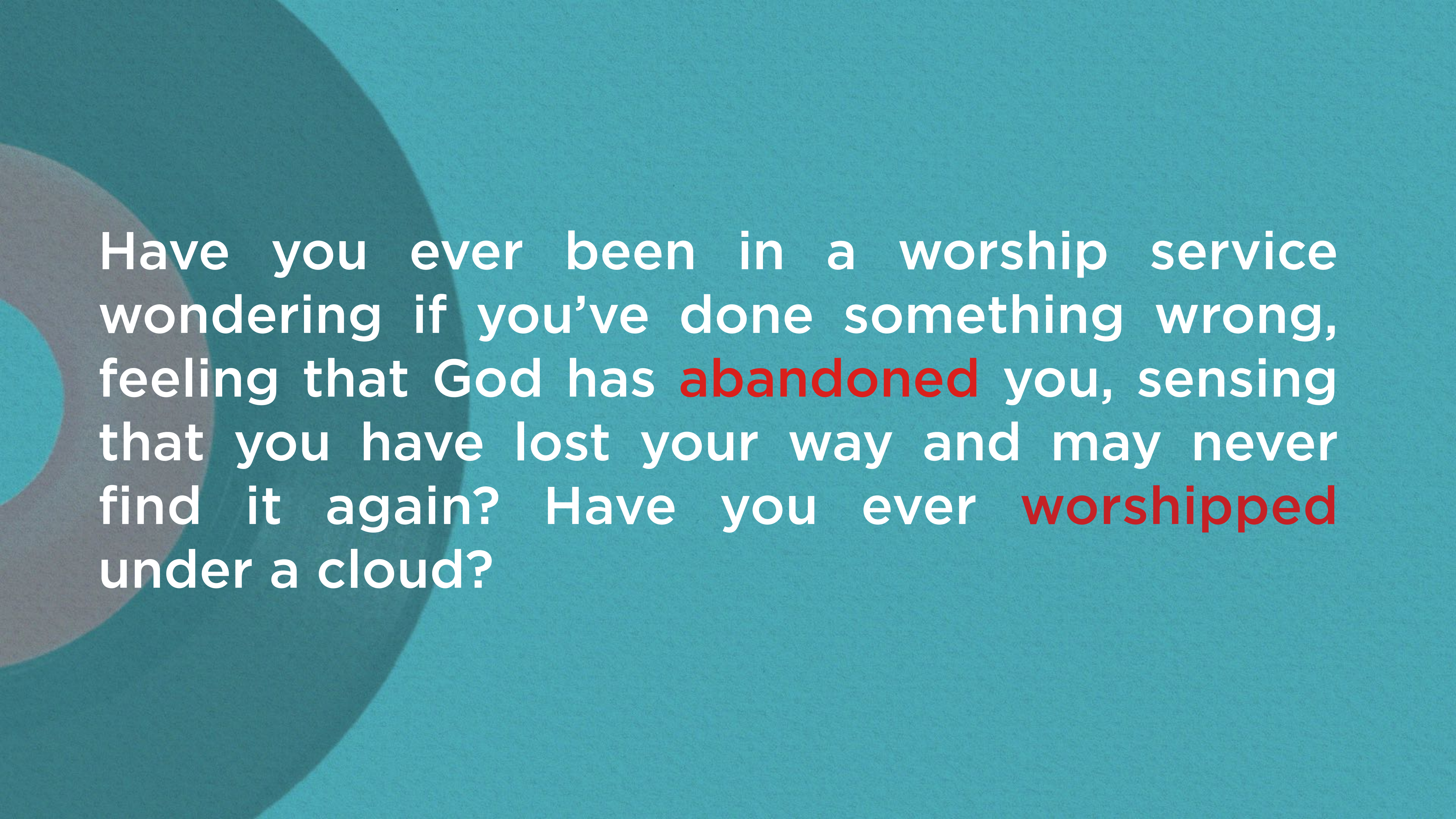


Clouds and thick darkness surround

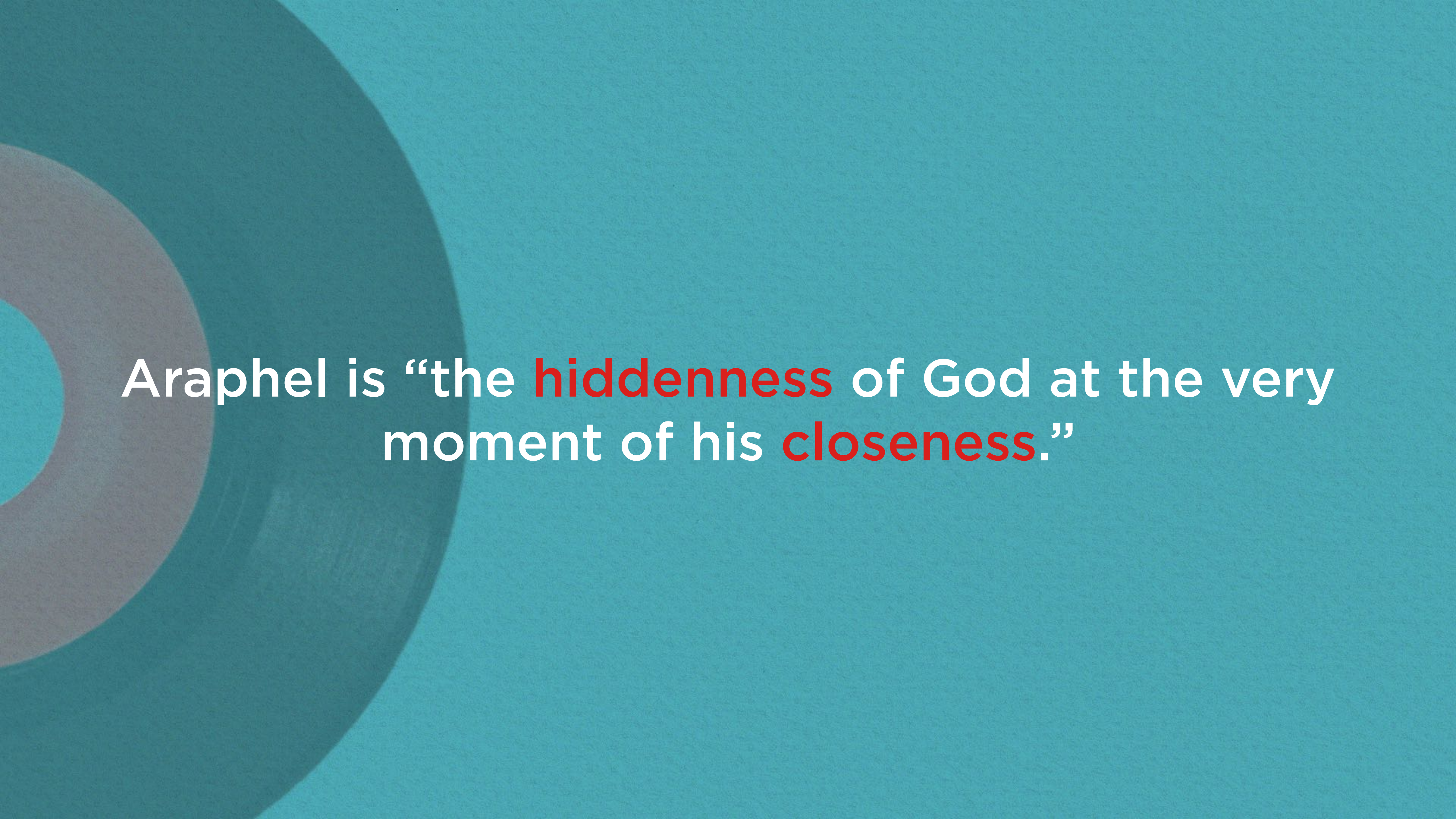
Psalm 97:2
