DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What was your major takeaway from the message this morning?
2. Think about the offering of water given to David by his friends Josheb, Eleazar, and Shammah. As David poured it out and did not drink it they could have been offended, but they understood that what they did was an act of worship for the Lord and it did not matter what David did with it. How would this understanding of worship change the way we approach serving others?
3. As we see in Psalm 63 David was a passionate worshipper of God. The cry of His heart was the foundation for many of his Psalms. Have you ever experienced that "heart cry"? How did that experience shape you?
4. We learned that the drink offering is a "lesson in worth". Through his suffering on the cross Christ showed us that his passion was for us, that we were worth it to Him. How does this understanding help us view ourselves? Others?
5. Read through Luke 7:36-47. The woman in this story is a beautiful picture of a life poured out. How did her story inspire you today?
6. In the same story we learn that Simon was a recipient of great mercy, yet he seemingly forgot. Do we ever forget? How can we keep ourselves in a place of "brokenness" before Jesus?
