Matthew 1:18-25

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When life goes wrong, do the right thing, the God-honoring way.

Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

Matthew 1:19

If a man happens to meet in a town a virgin pledged to be married and he sleeps with her, you shall take both of them to the gate of that town and stone them to death - the young woman because she was in a town and did not scream for help, and the man because he violated another man's wife.

Deuteronomy 22:23-24a

1. Someone betrothed is also referred to as a man's wife.
2. The law advocates stoning but there's no indication that this was practiced in Galilee in Joseph's days.
3. The law seems harsh on women, but the text presupposes compliance.
