KEY SCRIPTURE:

Nehemiah 1:1-4

1. We read that Nehemiah had so much compassion for his people that it led him to tears. Would you say you are a “crier?” What does it usually take to get you to tears?
2. Nehemiah is one of the greatest leaders in the Bible as he partnered with God to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem in 52 days. Name some traits and characteristics you see in Nehemiah and other great leaders you admire. What makes a Godly leader that is worth looking up to?
3. If people watched your life for a week what do you think they would say you are passionate about? What do you wish they would say you are passionate about?
4. What does it look like for you to align your passions with God’s passions? What do you feel God is most passionate about in your life and the lives of those around you right now?
5. Nehemiah was able to act on the passion he had in his heart from God because he correctly identified the people God was calling him to serve, love, and reach. Name one or two people you feel God is leading you to serve, love, and reach. What stands in the way of doing that?
6. James 5:16 says that the “fervent” or passionate prayer of a Godly person is very effective. What passion level have your prayers been at lately? What does it look like to turn regular prayers into “fervent” prayers
